PPPs – UK experience

- PPP not about private finance but better procurement
- Different PPP models for different situations, eg for
 - -Toll road
 - New hospital building
 - -Cleaner, greener streets
 - IT system for health patient records



European regime

- Flexibility to treat each situation differently
- Flexibility to evolve over time
- Hence not a specific legislation for PPP
- But each strand of legal framework must be "fit for purpose"



Commission progress

- New package: competitive dialogue; social and environmental factors
- PPP Green Paper: helps to clarify role of different legal instruments
- Recognises fair procurement is way to ensure fair contract management
- Ideas for exchanging good practice



Emerging debate

- Need rules for service concessions?
- How should public sector respond to private sector's innovative ideas?
- How to ensure fair competition between the private sector and an entrepreneurial public sector?



Key requirements now

- Preserve flexibility and encourage PPP to evolve
- Continue to explain which rules apply in which situations
- Continue to stress the breadth of PPP – notably in service provision
- Stress that public & private sector commitment and skills are crucial
