# DEAR MEMBER OF THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT

You can vote for a safe REACH system that works for both consumers and enterprises.

To do so, you can support the Council Common Position on authorisation / substitution of certain chemicals which is a balanced solution aimed at enhancing health and environment while encouraging innovation and competitiveness. Based on the concept of adequate control of risk, the Common Position is already a compromise between the original Commission proposal and your 1st reading.

### **EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT 1st READING** ON AUTHORISATION WITHIN REACH

- **I** Substitutes have to be used regardless of adequate control of risk in current production processes
- Even if no alternatives are available, socio-economic benefits (outweighing risks) are not considered a sufficient criterion for granting an authorisation - as a consequence some substances would be banned without alternatives
- Authorisation is limited to a five-year period
- Authorisation is accompanied by a substitution plan

# The EP places disproportionate burdens on industry because:

- mandatory substitution does not take into account efforts by companies to secure adequate control of risktimeframes for substitution are too short
- Strict requirements will hamper potential for change and for developing innovative solutions
- European production will be disrupted with no automatic benefits for health and the environment

#### **INDUSTRY HAS SERIOUS CONCERNS ABOUT THE EP 1st READING ON AUTHORISATION**

#### VERSUS COUNCIL COMMON POSITION ON AUTHORISATION WITHIN REACH FAVOURED BY EUROPEAN ENTERPRISES

- Authorisation is granted if adequate control of risk is proved by companies and verified by the Agency / European Commission
- Authorisation is granted if socio-economic benefits outweigh the risk, until suitable alternatives become available. Socioeconomic analysis is provided by companies, and verified by the Agency / European Commission
- Authorisation is reviewed regularly with a duration set on a case-by-case basis
- Authorisation is accompanied by an analysis of alternatives

# The Council presents a flexible and balanced solution because:

- substitution is encouraged by a stepwise approach
- it will help industry to find smart and innovative solutions
- it fosters adaptation to change
- it takes into account the competitive environment faced daily by EU industry, and in particular by SMEs
