Trade&Security: BUSINESSEUROPE Activities



- Customs security
- EU legislation
- Cooperation with the US Government
- Joint activities with US business (US Chamber of Commerce)





Approach to Trade & Security

- Combine Security with Trade Facilitation
- Focus on risk
- Standardise to lower costs





AEO System

BUSINESSEUROPE Supports AEO

- Improve security
- Responsible companies
- Partnership Business + Government
- Only for Extra Europe (EU/EEA/TK)





Criteria for success

- Cost-effective programme
- Major simplification for controls
- Avoid complex procedures
- Clear benefits for AEO companies
- Ensure SMEs benefit/not harmed
- Mutual recognition with 3rd countries





US: The Positive Agenda on Trade & Security

- 30 April Transatlantic Economic Council (TEC)
- Includes cooperation on trade & security
- Cooperation on standards in WCO



US - Objective: mutual recognition of CTPAT(US) and AEO (EU)

Customs-Trade Partnership against Terrorism

- Companies: info on imports to US
- Homeland Security: targets risky cargo

Authorised Economic Operator

- Companies: info on imports & exports
- EU Customs: target risky cargo

Cooperation & mutual recognition will reduce risk, speed up trade

Win-win for trade & security





Other possible partners

- Japan
- Russia
- China





US 100% Scanning Legislation

- August 2007: Congress adopted 100% scanning rule
- Implementation: delayed for 5 years
- MAJOR DISRUPTIONS TO INTERNATIONAL TRADE EXPECTED





Problems with 100% scanning

Delays

- 10 mins to scan 1 container
- US imports 11 million containers/year

Technological problems

- Technology for rapid scanning
- Too much information

Other problems

- Ignores risk-based approach
- Reduces cooperation on supply chain security





US Test cases: 100% Scanning

- Cost= US\$ 577 per container
- EU Ports most affected:

- **Bremen:** 570,000

- **Antwerp:** 450,000

- Rotterdam: 400,000





BUSINESSEUROPE Action

Cooperation with US Chamber

- Oppose 100 % scanning
- Support public-private cooperation on risk-based supply chain security

Future actions

- Create coalition on the issue
- Lobby new US Administration + Congress
