What are we talking about?

□ 180 Billion euros to businesses if public authorities paid outstanding bills within a period of 30 days.


In Italy:

- □ 60 billions euros of credits of companies vis-à-vis the PA
- □ 5 billions euros is the amount provided by the Italian Government to recover from the crisis



Average payment duration in days in PA2B contracts



I Comment

- General support to the proposal
- Distinction between B2B and B2PA:
 - PA cannot commit to a contract without having budgeted the amount ex-ante
 - PA have a secure flow of income
 - Payment delays are substantially longer



II Comment

- No distinction between SMEs and large companies:
 - Distortion of competition;
 - ✓ SMEs are essential suppliers of large companies in integrated supply chains;
 - ✓ Big contracts (or procurement) are unachievable for SMEs, which associate with larger companies to take part in calls;



III Comment

- No exemptions for specific sectors
- Improvements of wording and structure of the article are needed (article 5.4 to be moved at the place of 5.2 for a stronger identification of the 30 days' binding limit)
- 3. Longer terms could be allowed, but must be duly justified under the principle of necessity, and never exceed a fixed terms (e.g. 45 days)



IV Comment

Some clarifications are needed:

- 1. 30...*Calendar* days or *working* days?
- 2. Definition of PA: referring to article 1.9 Directive 2004/18/EC and art.2.1 Directive 2004/17/EC
- 3. Improving the structure of the articles (specify that articles 3 and 4 refer only to contracts between undertakings)
