
Priorities for Europe's external competitiveness 2010-2014

Global Economy

Export-driven growth

- Forecast EU real GDP 1.8% (2010) / 1.7% (2011)
- World trade +4,3% (2010) and +6,2% (2011)
- Growth in emerging countries

Risks of stimulus-driven growth

- Economic nationalism/protectionism
- Exit strategies (budget cuts)
- Financial market regulation (de-integration)





Improvements to Global Europe

- <u>Competitiveness focus</u> as in Global Europe
- Four areas of work
 - Negotiations and enforcement
 - Strategic partners
 - Trade enabling policies
 - Coordination across Commission services (trade/enterprise)





Trade Policies

- Focus on competitiveness
- Access to emerging markets (NTBs)
- Free trade in raw materials
- Protection of IPR and technology





- <u>WTO Doha Round</u>: Chemical agreement, energy efficient power equipment
- <u>Bilateral FTAs</u>: Korea, Canada, Ukraine, India, ASEAN countries
- <u>New issues</u>: IPR+, NTBs, raw materials, regulatory cooperation





Strategic Dialogues

- US: Transatlantic Economic Council
- China: High-level Economic Dialogue
- Russia: Investment and industrial dialogue
- Brazil: taxation issues, regulatory cooperation, infrastructure





Cooperation with Japan

- Focus on regulatory cooperation, NTBs
- Ensure effective implementation of §34 issues
- Creation of high-level EU-Japan Economic Partnership Council (EUJ-EPC):
 - achievable targets on specific regulatory issues, NTBs
 - straightforward timeframe
 - progress measured annually





Specific challenges

- Emerging country markets
- No strategic EU vision
- Too defensive EU (NTBs)?
- Working with European Parliament
- Cooperation with External Action Service
- Opposition to open markets policy
